Spotlight on Development - Mathematics


Mathematical knowledge, interests, and skills are basic to children's success in school and later life. From a very early age, mathematics

How can parents help?

- * Board games and card games that involve counting, addition and introduce symbols like spades and clubs help reinforce early math skills and improve children's number knowledge.
 - * Have children create patterns with objects they have, like colorful socks.
