## **Fine Motor Skills**

The small muscles in the hands and wrists are developing rapidly during the preschool years. These muscles are what allow students to effectively hold a pencil, use scissors, and manipulate small objects. Our teachers create many interesting activities for their students the help them develop fine motor skills, such as these fun fine motor journals that Miss Jylian created which allow students to use a wide variety of materials to work those muscles! At home, you can help by providing playdough for your child to create with. You can also gather up a pair of tongs, a few bowls, and some small objects. Your child will enjoy picking up the objects with the tongs and dropping them into the bowls. Change up the items to hold their interest.

# **Pyramid Model**

Our Preschool has adopted the **Pyramid Model**, an evidence-basedpractice framework that promotes young children's healthy social and emotional development. Under the Pyramid model, we strive to do the following:

Create learning environments where EVERY child feels good about coming to school and encourage child engagement so that children have the comfort of knowing: a) What is expected of me right now? b) How will I know if I'm doing it right? c) How long will it last? And d) what will I be doing next?

• Focus on teaching children what TO DO rather than what not to do by: Teaching behavioral expectation and routines, and skills that children can use in place of challenging behaviors.
